


Buildings need maintenance

IMPACTS OF THE INFRASTRUCTURE CRISIS:

STUDENTS:

Crowded classes and hallways, Concerns about safety
Not enough lockers, Less programming choice
Less enrichment spaces; music, library, art, science, sport

Your experiences???

STAFF:

Less staff room space

Large class sizes

Burnout and turnover

Less support in classrooms

FAMILIES:

Less available childcare in school buildings

Increased travel times

Lotteries at 7 schools, so families don't get school of choice

DEFERRED MAINTENANCE IS CURRENTLY \$910 MILLION



5 NEW PROJECTS NEEDED PER YEAR VS 1.7 ACTUAL




WHAT ARE POSSIBLE SOLUTIONS / ROLES FOR ELECTED OFFICIALS AND THE PUBLIC
